Course Fees

Course description - What is the course about?

This qualification is suitable for anyone wanting to gain knowledge and skills in caring for children however you must be 16 years old or over. This will allow you to learn, develop and practise the skills required for employment/or career progression in the childcare sector. This qualification is fully funded to those who are 19-24 years of age or those in receipt of universal credits.

This course will be taught online, for half a day a week. There will be 10 taught sessions and the course will run over 10 weeks. You will also be offered one to one sessions to help and support you if necessary. You will be expected to be committed and attend all the taught sessions.

Key Learning Outcomes/Units/Modules

You will produce a portfolio of evidence which will be made up of 4 assignments. The topics that will be covered, as assignments are:

- Listening to and talking with young children
- Respecting and valuing children
- Practical Health and Safety when with young children
- Self-development

How is this course delivered and assessed?

You will be taught using a blended learning approach, with classroom-based activities and some online resources, where you will be provided with opportunities to develop your skills in, English and ICT.

You will have the opportunities to engage in discussion and ways to practice your skills when you are at home.

How much study will I be expected to do at home?

You are expected to do at least a 2-3 hours per week of home study and activities to be successful on this programme.

Entry requirements (existing skills, knowledge)

Basic understanding of spoken and written English and some knowledge of Maths.

What digital skills and equipment do I require?

Basic digital skills would be an advantage but not essential. We would recommend access to a laptop and good internet speeds to help and assist with any digital content.

Do I require any kit, equipment, materials or specific books

Laptop would be beneficial. Basic stationery and notebook.

What progression opportunities are available?

Once you have completed the Award, you could advance to the Level 2 Diploma in Early Years Practitioner or Intermediate Apprenticeship programme.
